

Level 3 Leading Forest School (RQF)

Course description

Our Level 3 Forest School Leader training will take you step by step to deliver your own Forest School **(FS)** sessions in your setting.

Course covers

- Planning and delivery of a minimum of six FS sessions
- Writing policies and procedures for the safe and effective practice of FS in your setting
- Carrying out formative and summative assessment of all sessions
- Understanding the management of the setting and issues of sustainability in the outdoor areas used for FS
- Ability to teach a range of practical tasks using a range of tools
- Understand how theories of learning, play and development apply at FS
- Understand how FS impacts on self-esteem, emotional intelligence and behaviour

Entry Qualifications

Applicants must show evidence of any **ONE** of the following (as well as demonstrating that they have links with a client group to enable their Forest School delivery during the course.)

- An educational qualification at Level 2 or above eg. PGCE, FETC, NNEB
- A qualification at Level 2 in Forest School, Woodland/Countryside (or similar)
- Two years' experience of working with a client group
- A portfolio of evidence and references equivalent to one of the above and be willing to be interviewed by the course Tutor/ Assessor

- Writing risk assessments
- Basic understanding of the management in the setting and issues of sustainability in the outdoor areas used for FS
- Safely carry out a range of practical tasks using a range of tools
- Understand how theories of learning, play and development apply at FS
- Understand how FS impacts on self-esteem, emotional intelligence and behaviour

Entry Qualifications

- 16 years and over
- Level 1 qualification or equivalent (GCSE):
- Establish link with a FS practitioner

Four units & 8 credits

- Supporting Learning, Play and Development in the Natural Environment.
- **2.** Assist at Forest School.
- 3. Sustainable Use and Management of Natural Resources.
- 4. Outdoor Practical Skills.

Length of course

- 4 days + ongoing tutorial sessions
- Planning and delivery of 3 FS sessions
- Up to 50 hours of self-directed study may be required
- 6 months to complete
